a higher burden than what's required by the law? Anybody at all?

Ladies and gentlemen, there will be no fingerprints in this case. There will be no weapon that was used. There will be no ballistics. There will be no blood. There will be no fingerprints, no video tape of the actual crime being committed. Do any of you require those things before you would personally convict somebody? Would you actually have to have physical scientific evidence before you could be satisfied that a crime had been committed or that a particular person had committed a crime? Anybody at all?

My last question since the Judge was so thorough, do any of you have any reason or know any reason whatsoever that either Judge McRae may not have asked you or that I may not have asked you at this time that you need to bring up or you should make us aware of before you're selected to sit on this particular jury? Anything at all? Yes, ma'am.

JUROR: I'm friends with Cathy.

MR. JORDAN: And that's Mrs. --

JUROR: Mackdanz.

MR. JORDAN: Mackdanz.

Cathy, by the way, is Cathy Dorsey, who is a trial coordinator, paralegal, works with our office.
